Theological English Enhancement Course

What is TEEC and who should take it?

TEEC is an intensive English course that equips students with theological English for future study at Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary.

Students who are qualified for PRTS admittance but have a TOEFL score between 68-84, or with a 40+ in TOEFL in the combination of the reading and writing parts.

Steps for applying MTTC

Applying	Complete PRTS admission application.
	Complete MTTC application.
Application Deadline	February 15th of each year.
Application Result	Students will receive the results at the beginning of March by e-mail. If accepted, students will receive the acceptance letter and the I-20 form in mail before the end of March.
Deposit	Upon full admittance (received by email), students should pay \$500 deposit within 7 days to confirm the admittance. * Deposit will be counted as part of the tuition when students pay

	the rest of the tuition.
VISA application	Once the students have received the acceptance letter and I-20 form from PRTS, students should apply for a US F1 VISA ASAP.
Tuition	Full tuition payment is expected by the first day of the course.

	Ask/answer questions theologically.
	Summarize lectures/books in speaking.
Reading	Recognize ways to efficiently read a book. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand main arguments and supporting details.
Writing	Recognize and adopt suitable ways to efficiently take notes.
	Write theological essays/papers with: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Clear outline. Coherent organization. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> clear main points and valid supporting details. Logical presentation of the arguments. Accurate grammar and vocabulary usage. Correctly citing of the resources.

Course Assessment

TOEFL Exam	Students will take the TOEFL exam on the nearest date upon completion of the language course. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Exam date will be decided by the course instructor. * Exam fee will be paid by PRTS.
Result: Pass or Fail	Students will pass the course if achieved 85 or above in the TOEFL exam. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * If students fail to achieve 85 in the TOEFL exam, students could choose either to go back to his/her country or to continue English study at a local ESL center at his/her own expense.
